John said, "This is the disciple who is bearing witness about these things, and who has written these things, and we know that his testimony is true" (Jn. 21:24). In 1 Jn. 1:1, John said, "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life..."

John closes his Gospel with a testimony about Jesus's **greatness**. John said, "Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written" (Jn. 21:25). John presented the **evidence**. The **invitation** is now given for us to trust, embrace, follow, and declare Jesus!
